CCC and CALCC Review Information to Assess Corps Capacity to Partner

CCC and CALCC will review the information submitted by the applicant and assess their conservation corps' capabilities to partner on project.



Corps Inform
Applicant &

If the project **IS** within the capabilities of the corps:

- · Each Conservation Corps will keep a list of projects they can partner on and send a list to Caltrans
- · Each Conservation Corps will inform Caltrans about which components of the project they can do and which corps can partner with the applicant

If the project is **NOT** within the capabilities of the corps:

- · Each Conservation Corps will notify Caltrans
- · There will be no penalty to the applicant

On the applications, applicants are required to include the following to <u>both</u> the CCC and CALCC:

- * Name
- * E-mail
- * Phone number of the person contacted
- * Date the information was submitted
- * Project items each corps are qualified to partner on

CALTRANS REVIEW



Caltrans Reviews
Applications and
Assigns Points for
Use of
Conservation
Corps

O-points: Applicant intends to partner with a conservation corps (either CCC or CALCC; applicant can partner with both conservation corps, but partnership with both is not required) to the maximum extent possible

Minus 5 points: Applicant did not seek partnership with either conservation corps, or indicated that they do not intend to partner with a conservation corps to the maximum extent possible

Once the Project is Funded:

- Applicant will need to justify Public Interest Finding (PIF) must show that conservation corps can do work for less than project estimate. If PIF not justified, conservation corps cannot be used on project.
- Once PIF is justified, conservation corps will enter into contract agreement with the applicant.

If applicant indicated on application that they intended to use either the CCC or CALCC, then fail to use/chose not to use corps after funding was received, the entity will receive negative points (up to minus 10 points) on the next ATP application.
